Bernie DeLeo (*Director*) is in Year 4 as the director of Marshall High School's theatre program. Prior to teaching, Mr. DeLeo spent 20+ years working on stage & screen (large & small), as an actor, playwright, sitcom writer, screenwriter, film producer/creative executive in New York, Los Angeles,

Chicago and Washington DC. He worked at Broadway's Circle in the Square Theatre, HBO, ABC & Disney Studios, as well as Arena Stage, Woolly Mammoth & other regional theatres. He is a graduate of Catholic University (BFA, Acting), Rutgers University (MFA, Playwriting) and George Washington University (MS, Special Education).

Mr. DeLeo discovered theatre in high school, and found it a welcoming environment where he could find out who he was and follow his dreams. He is thrilled to have come full circle as a high school teacher, creating the same home for students to explore their talents and make lifelong friends. Director's Notes: A Show with Frog & Toad!

Here we are, at the last and hardest show of the season—our annual spring musical—and it's good to be back onstage with a live band once again. One of the questions I like to answer in this space is, why THIS show? What inspired to you to pick this musical?

If you've been following the shows I've chosen for the past few years (my 4th at Marshall), you'll see that I have eclectic tastes. I never like to do the same thing or style of show twice. If students are going to be with me for 4 years, I want them to experience a wide range of shows, challenges and genres, which require different types of singing and acting. And so I will change things up, year after year.

Coming out of the pandemic, my main goal this year was to experience the joys of live theatre again, and for actors, crew & audience to have a rollicking good time, especially with the fall & spring shows. (I mean, we all lived through such a depressing time—let's smile again at the theatre, right??) I especially liked the idea of doing a children's show—and pulling in family audiences. Due to the pandemic, this may be the first live theatre that small children have ever seen, and I thought it would be rewarding to bring them into our space to see a really fun show. So I set out looking...

I'd discovered the *Frog & Toad* soundtrack on Spotify last year, and was instantly hooked, humming its toe-tapping tunes. THAT for me is Consideration No. 1—if I have to listen to a show for 6 months to a year, I'd better love the score—and not get sick of hearing it on repeat every day for a good quarter of a year.

But I'd also had a personal connection this show: not only had I read these books to my own kids when they were young, but we owned this hilariously weird Claymation Frog & Toad video (yes, on VHS) that my daughter and I still nerd out over and quote lines from ("We're not afraid!" "What is...will power?") (I still own it, but alas, have nothing to play it on!) The stories are fabulously funny fables about the ever-patient Frog and his dorky, at times exasperating friend, Toad.
